

ASA Professional membership provisions based on Rule 4. (2)

Professional membership of the ASA is open to any person who is or has been an archivist employed in a recognized archives institution who

Is not a graduate of a recognized university	Is a graduate of a recognized university	Holds a qualification in archives administration accredited by the ASA OR An equivalent as judged by the ASA Council
And has been so employed for 3 years	And has been so employed for 2 years	And has been so employed for 1 year

NOTE: the conditions in the shaded column do not apply after 31 December 1980 *unless Council otherwise so determines.*

All decisions as to the eligibility of persons for professional membership of the ASA shall be the responsibility of the Council of the Society alone and such interpretations and decisions shall be final.

The first prerequisite in the Rules is that the prospective professional archivist is an archivist working in a recognized archives institution.

RMAA Professional membership provisions based on By-Law No. 6.

Professional membership of the RMAA is open to Information, Records Management and Archives Officers who

Graduate with a recognised records management qualification from a university or VET Certificate IV course; and	Demonstrate evidence of skills in three of four criteria – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Development of a classification scheme; - Development of a control vocabulary; - Document a business or records system; - Management of records in a business domain; and
Obtain three years experience with at least two years in a position of responsibility.	Obtain five years experience with at least two years in a position of responsibility.

All decisions as the eligibility of persons for professional membership of the RMAA shall be the responsibility of the Board of the Association alone and such interpretations and decisions shall be final.
